Grace and peace to you from Jesus who loves us.

It's AGM season and congregations will be sitting down together to undertake visioning, discussion and decisions for the upcoming year. While sometimes it may seem like the same old thing year after year, we must remember that motions, budgets and voting are also a ministry of stewardship as we bridge where we have come from, and the future God is leading us into.



Many years ago, when the journey to seminary began, there appeared a card in our church mailbox. It was from an elderly woman of the congregation, Helen. It was a card of encouragement for Ken and I and the journey of ministry before us. Included in the card was five dollars. It may not sound like much, but it had a powerful impact on us both. That first contribution taught us that ministry is not of our own doing but is the love and care of us together passed from one generation to the next.

Think about Helen as you plan to meet. Helen, who contributed to the work of the church, work from which she wasn't likely to directly benefit. Helen knew however, that ministry wasn't about her or even Ken and I, but about tomorrow. She understood she was included in the need to *steward* the future of ministry for arriving generations.

Some congregations will be facing difficult decisions this AGM. It may be a ministry transition, another year without a minister and in some cases even the decision to sell a church property. Those are just the practical ones. There are also faith challenges too. Times when we feel the pain of decline or continuing conflict, we may feel somewhat hopeless or doubting if God is even around.

We are at a crossroads in North American life today. It may feel that much is at stake. We might be tempted to cling tenaciously to what we have left. So, I remind you that God is a generous God. God is a future God. God has already given us what we need to continue in the life of faith.



Perhaps you could make time to give thanks for those who came before, purchased land, fostered Sunday schools and building projects, those who stepped into an unknown future with hope but no certainty. How will you ensure the future of ministry, even if you or your membership does not directly benefit?

For those of you who will attend your AGM – thank you for the gift of your presence. For those of you who will hear and accept the call to serve in leadership – thank you for

listening. To those of you who cannot be present – hear the call to pray for your church family. For those who face difficult decisions – remember you are not alone.

I pray that we will remember that we are larger than our individual congregations and I trust that God will bless you as you meet together.

Our VBS took place August 19-23rd and 98+ children were shown how they could “dive into a friendship with God”. Central Lutheran became an underwater wonderland as our VBS team displayed their awesome talent and dedication to this outreach that touches so many children in our community.

Sunday school classes began again in September with 11 children ranging in ages from 5 to 11. No confirmation class started this fall.

Stacy Lloyd worked her magic to create a wonderful Christmas performance on December 22nd. The children joined the adult choir for a song, “What Did the Star See? The blend of the voices was truly magical and heartwarming. Then we were inspired by the story behind the Christmas carol favourite, Silent Night. 2024 Property Committee Report
Ken Berg & Ed Masson

We did not incur any significant repair or maintenance items in 2024. Our snow removal and grass cutting was looked after by two local contractors, who did an excellent job. The following are specific items that were looked after or organized by committee members.

- A new janitor(Tina Peterson) was hired in April.
- The annual church yard clean up was held in early May.
- In June, Ken sprayed weeds around the church and met with a Town of Provost employee to put burn off chemicals down the church septic system to remove roots that are impacting the sewer pipes. This will need to be done every year.
- A new vacuum cleaner was purchased in July.
- In early summer, repairs were made to the mantle in the fireplace room, as it had come loose from the wall. Thanks for the great work, Trevor.
- In August, Ken sprayed weeds around the church.
- In October we switched our church internet service provider from Telus to SwiftNet. The resulting increase in upload speed/bandwidth will allow funerals and other events to be live streamed from our church.
- In November the leaves were cleaned out of the parking lot.

Skyline Church Historical Society Annual Report – 2024

Skyline Church Historical Society (SCHS) recommended Stacey Lakevold be hired to mow the grass and maintain the cemetery grounds at the Skyline Cemetery for 2024. He has submitted an invoice for his maintenance hours directly to the Provost Central Lutheran Church.

There was one burial at Skyline Cemetery during 2024: Ken Stuber (August). In accordance with the Provost Central Lutheran Church Cemeteries Bylaw #7 all record keeping and plot purchases were handled by the Provost Central Lutheran Church and Gregory's Funeral Home.

The installation of new siding has been scheduled for spring of 2025. The siding supplies for the Skyline Church building have already been purchased with the proceeds from the January 2022 Casino.

Thanks to the continuing work and dedication of Iris Larson and Janet Paulgaard all known burials at Skyline Cemetery are recorded on the website findagrave.com and most headstones have been photographed. A short history of Skyline Cemetery is also on this website. Janet Paulgaard has updated the burial list to include the 2024 burials.


Annual Report 2024

Pastor's Report for 2024

"But to what will I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the marketplaces and calling to one another, 'We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we wailed, and you did not mourn.'" (Matthew 11:16-17)

With a new regime down south and the prospect of a new regime in our country, we are guaranteed to fulfill the Chinese curse, "May you live in interesting times!" Regardless, we have the tasks that God has given us to do in front of us, and they provide a solid foundation in "interesting times." Here are the highlights of our past year together in ministry:

Outreach:

Our signature event for outreach was Vacation Bible School in August, "SCUBA", and the response by the community was excellent, with attendance near 90 children per day, and many volunteers from outside the congregation. We held Free Garage Sales in both May (indoors) and September (outdoors), and many people found them valuable. We started a weekly GriefShare meeting in October for those who have recently lost loved ones – it will run until February and if the demand is there, we will offer it again in 2025. And we continued to offer the use of our building to the Girl Guides and the Music Festival Association.

Wider Church:

Synod Convention was held from June 22-24 at Kings in Edmonton, at which we elected a new synod bishop Trish Schmermund on the third ballot. Your delegates to this convention were Vivian Baier and myself. National Convention will be held July 10-13, 2025, and that will include the election of a new national bishop, as Bishop Susan Johnson has announced her retirement.

Education:

Massive thanks to our Sunday School superintendent, teachers, parents, and volunteers for their efforts in continuing to make Sunday School possible, this is a critical ministry! On June 2, we confirmed Tenley Kostiuk, Violet McElhinney, Adam Petersen, Lena Spencer, Maxwell Spencer, Colton Swanson, and Grenville Swanson in their Lutheran faith. Confirmation class is now on hiatus, waiting for students to reach the appropriate age. Bible study is ongoing at the nursing home, and on Wednesday evenings.

Worship:

Average Sunday morning worship attendance for 2023 held the line at 41, no change from last year but still down from our 2019 pre-pandemic average of 55. Pre-recorded services were provided every week on the website (including Sundays where there was no in-person service due to vacation), and on average they were accessed by 5 devices before Sunday noon. Our Lenten sermon series was on the Fruits of the Spirit, as described by Paul in his letter to the Galatians, and attendance at the midweek Lenten soup suppers and services averaged 19. We mourned the loss of Kim Larson in 2024, and I presided at sixteen other funerals and interments in the community. I also presided at two weddings of people not attached to our congregation. Shockingly, there were no baptisms in our congregation in 2024 – your pastor needs to get busy!

No major issues came up at either the church or the parsonage – thank you, Jesus!


Personal:
